### Player Development

Last Wednesday we had one of the all time best Player Development sessions yet. The energy level was off the charts! We had 8 Facilitators, one for each two participants. Stations were Serves, Ball Machine (Ground Strokes, Volleys & Drop Shots), Play Analysis...getting to the net strategies and Unforced Errors Play. We also videotaped participants at the Serve station to provide instant replay opportunities. This is a new initiative that will prove to be very valuable.

The data that we collected from the Unforced Errors station will provide the focus for our next PD session. The majority of unforced errors were "balls into the net" and "out of bounds" balls (mostly beyond the baseline...some sideline). Our intent is to reduce, if not eliminate, unforced errors. Think we can do that?!?

Remember that next Wednesday, October 21 the courts have been reserved for unsupervised practice on skills and drills. Come one, come all and practice on whatever your heart desires. The Ball Machine is available for checkout for this block time. Have fun and enjoy doing your drills.
