KEOWEE KEY SPRING PICKLEBALL TOURNAMENT

The Keowee Key 2016 Spring Pickleball Tournament was held on Saturday, the 23rd with excellent weather – after the courts were dried. It is clear that the level of pickleball skill is increasing in both the intermediate and advanced levels with most players now coming to the net to play their shots – dinks, slams, recovery, more dinks, lobs, and final put aways - well done all around.

In the two round format, Leslie Walker won the Intermediate group contest with 81 total points followed closely by a 3 way tie for second place with Jean Petersen, Deneen Bell, and Linda Morgan all scoring 80 points – an extremely close and exciting set of matches. This closeness in scoring (1 point) emphasizes the importance of working for every point in a match - even if you don't win the game - your total score across all 6 games can make the difference.

In the Advanced group, Nancy Lenkowski won first place with a total of 88 points (out of a possible 90) followed by second place finisher Karen Daniels with 81 total points. Ann Savoca finished in third place with 78 points followed by Tricia Phillips (of Stillwater) with 75 points.

As in most pickleball tournaments, the level of competition is high as well as the level of fun – the concentration on shots is equally matched with the laughter and camaraderie on court.

Ladies - well done.

Player Development

Last Wednesday's Self-Directed Player Development practice saw another substantial group of eager people who worked on various aspects of their skills and strategies. The ball machine went non-stop for the entire time. People got to work on whatever was of value to them. For those who are not certain, please let people know that you would like to work on something in particular and we'll make it happen.

In an effort to link our competition efforts with Player Development, observations of the Keowee Key Spring Pickleball Tournament play provided reinforcement that what we are attempting to provide in our Player Development sessions are on target. Participants clearly demonstrated skills and strategies that provided exciting games. Fundamentals such as, consistent Serves "in", controlled ground strokes, "keep the ball in play", "down the middle" shots, keep eyes on the ball as it hits the paddle provided evidence that participants

have been practicing and improving. We will be continuing to integrate the fundamentals of the game into our Facilitator led Player Development sessions.

The next Facilitator led Player Development session is Wednesday, April 27th at 10 AM. Please sign-up for one of the 16 spots at jswalker5233d@gmail.com and let me know specifically what skills, drills and/or strategies might be of greatest value to you. We will be showcasing a new training aid for ground stroke control. There are already 5 people registered, so don't miss out.

The Elliotts will be at Keowee Key again this year on the weekend of June 24th and will conduct clinics on June 25th. As a club member, you can sign up now at a discounted rate of \$25 for a 1.5 hour clinic. Similar to last year, each clinic can accommodate 16 participants.
